-Substitute children's names (with their permission).

## Rhyming Basket Small Group Game

Put pairs of objects that rhyme (sock/rock, shoe/glue, etc.) in a basket. With children, identify & discuss the objects. Pass around and have the children locate a pair of objects that rhyme. Can sing, "A tisket, a tasket, let's play the rhyming basket."

## Odd One Out Small Group Game

Put picture cards or small objects out for children to see that 2 rhyme and 1 that is different. Point to the cards/objects and slightly exaggerate the ending sound of each item as you identify them. Ask the children "which one doesn't sound (end) the same?" Rinse and repeat.

## I Spy Game

Invite children to make "binoculars" to use play the "I Spy" game in the classroom or outdoors. Go on a hunt for rhyming words: "I spy something that rhymes with wable!" The children brainstorm to find what objects rhymes with "wable".

-Substitute children's names (with their permission)
